Financial Literacy for Success: AAP GPS Partners with CalKIDS Institute and HowMoneyWorks @ UCLA

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The Academic Advancement Program (AAP) Graduate & Professional School (GPS) Exploration Services welcomed the UCLA CalKIDS Institute and HowMoneyWorks @ UCLA to its Winter 2025 Financial Literacy Workshop: From Stress to Success—Mastering Your Money Mindset. This collaborative event marked a significant step in AAP GPS's mission to equip students with essential academic and financial tools for long-term success.

AAP GPS's Annual Winter Workshop

AAP GPS Exploration Services provides AAP-eligible students and alumni with personalized mentorship, workshops, and resources to navigate graduate school applications and professional opportunities. This year, the program expanded its focus to financial literacy, ensuring students gain the knowledge needed to manage financial stress and build wealth for the future.

The CalKIDS Institute Presentation

As part of the workshop, the UCLA CalKIDS Institute delivered an engaging session on the CalKIDS program, a statewide initiative that provides children's savings accounts to eligible students for college and career training. Attendees learned how to claim up to \$1,500 in funds and explored strategies for using these resources effectively.

During the session, students were guided through:

- *Eligibility Requirements*: CalKIDS funds are available to California public school graduates (classes of 2022, 2023, and 2024) and newborns born on or after July 1, 2022. Eligible students include those from low-income households, English learners, foster youth, unhoused students, and migratory students.
- *Claiming Funds:* Attendees received step-by-step instructions on using their Statewide Student Identifier (SSID) to check eligibility and access funds.
- *Financial Well-Being Tips:* The presentation emphasized how these funds can alleviate financial burdens by covering tuition, school supplies, or other qualified educational expenses.
